1. Illegal Dump Site Cleanup Coordination, Beautification, Graffiti Removal Projects throughout the Wyoming Valley
2. Clearing of brush, saplings, invasive plants, birch tree saplings for the Huber Breaker Memorial Garden and Paver Project to honor Anthracite Region Miners, adjacent to the EPCAMR office and directly in front of the Huber Breaker, Ashley Borough
3. Collection, Harvesting, Drying, and Packaging of Recycled Iron Oxide from an AMD Treatment System (Dundee Wetlands-Phase 2) and four AMD mine discharges located within the Wyoming Valley (HoneyPot (Susquehanna #7), Solomon's Creek, Plainsville Borehole, and Newport Lake) for EPCAMR's Environmental Education Programs
4. Creation of Set Design, backgrounds, props, supplies, and costumes for our future AMD Avengers vs. Pollution Posse Theatrical Comedy Skit Performances
5. Assistance with the creation of press releases, volunteer recruitment opportunities, and status updates for our EPCAMR FaceBook Site and homepage at www.epcamr.org
6. Assistance with watershed education tours with local elementary students to various abandoned mine sites, abandoned mine discharges (AMD), water monitoring and biological monitoring, and local historical preservation sites
