Project Coordination

Mill Creek/Gardener Creek Coldwater Conservation Plan Project

Received the Award letter from the PA Council of Trout Unlimited and signed it and sent
it back to Rachel Kester, Program Manager after amending the budget page; Bob Kent,
EPCAMR volunteer and avid fly-fisherman provided us some insight and a map of the
Gardner Creek watershed that he's fished and the locations of native brook trout
populations for us to assess

PA American Water Mill Creek Watershed Temperature Monitoring Program (proposed)

Steve Cornia, EPCAMR GIS Watershed Specialist and the Executive Director prepared a \$10,000 proposal to install Our project proposes to deploy ~30-40 HOBO TidbiT MX Temperature 400': Stream Temperature Data Loggers in various locations in stream reaches throughout the Mill Creek watershed, Luzerne County, PA. The temperature loggers will be set up to collect data on a 15-minute interval; Temperature monitoring stations within the Mill Creek Watershed will be used to assess the stream health throughout the year: All the data collected will be housed on EPCAMR's server and will be made available to the public and PA American Water as an interactive web interface run by ArcGIS Online; In the long term, after several years of data has been collected, we will use the combination of ArcGIS software and statistical models to develop a temperature regime for the entire Mill Creek watershed that will be sustainable; Having this data easily available will give municipalities, water authorities, watershed groups, Trout Unlimited Chapters, Conservation Districts, and other stakeholders the tools and information they need in order to make informed decisions on managing our watershed in the future; If this project is successful and we can continue to find the funding, we anticipate expanding the study to include other watersheds throughout the region

- Contacted Congressman Cartwright and Meuser's Office to relay EPCAMR's support
 and advocacy for several bills related to abandoned mine land reclamation and
 reauthorization under the CARES 2 Package; The following suite of bills were always
 important to building the bright future we want to see in our region, but the current crisis
 has underscored the need for urgent investment in the future of our communities; These
 bills could be an important part of the infrastructure investments that Congress is
 considering in future stimulus bills:
 - Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act Amendments of 2019 (H.R.4248), to address the clean-up of dangerous and polluting abandoned mine lands;
 - RECLAIM Act (H.R. 2156), to spur immediate job creation and create the conditions for longer term, locally driven economic development efforts in coal communities; and
 - 3. Black Lung Benefits Disability Trust Fund Solvency Act (H.R.3876), to adequately fund the Black Lung Disability Trust Fund at prior level for 10 years.
- The ongoing crisis caused by Covid19 has laid painfully bare longstanding issues we face in our region; The anxiety that families feel across the country as they lose their employment has been long felt in coal communities; We know that the most vulnerable in our society, those who already face health issues or economic challenges, are hit hardest in this impossible time; Many of those people and communities are in the region that we serve; Many families in our area have been escaping to some of these former reclaimed abandoned mine lands and the recreational opportunities and trails that they offer locally to get outdoors and still be able to remain socially distant; They have actually become places of tranquility and meditation, as well as an escape from the more urbanized and overcrowded parks in our City centers; These bills can provide the jobs that we are going to need post-COVID-19; An organization like EPCAMR is going to depend on being able to have the opportunity to apply for these types of funds with our private partners to improve our local environment; Right now, many of these areas locally are seeing an explosion of illegal dumping and littering as well with medical wastes, garbage, and household hazardous wastes; We are going to need to take extra precautions during our future cleanup efforts; At the same time, our region has a rich history of strength during adversity; We work to support each other during tough times; It is important to focus on the immediate needs during this pandemic, but it is also important to consider legislation that will make our region more resilient to future storms that are sure to follow; The choices our government makes during the outbreak of this virus could set a better course for a brighter future
