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December 2018 Progress Report

Education & Outreach

- Talked to Branden Diehl, Foundation for PA Watersheds PA AML Campaign to find out if we can get an updated determination of the "cost/acre of reclamation" estimate that has been often used by EPCAMR and the PA AML Campaign since we're updating the PA Congressional Maps and new districts with new PA AML Statistics; It was suggested that we reach out to PA DEP BAMR
- Jen Orr, Director of Compacts & Commissions Office of the PA DEP, informed EPCAMR that she had a contact with a rail company in Williamsport, PA that might be interested in donating towards the Lokie Restoration Fundraiser being conducted by the Huber Breaker Preservation Society (HBPS); Forwarded the information on to Don Kane, Jr. with the HBPS; Followed up with Niel Vierson, President of Vierson Boiler & Repair Company in Grand Rapids, MI about their Vulcan Steam Locomotive that the HBPS is looking to purchase and restore and verified that the requests for a quote of the purchase price was legitimate and necessary for a Local Service grant being proposed by the HBPS; Received the proposal and sale price and forwarded it to Don Kane Jr. to forward to Ray Clarke
- Participated in the RECLAIM Working Group conference call; Provided Lyndsay Taurus, Alliance for Appalachia, and a lead on the National RECLAIM Working Group with an example of EPCAMR's RAMLIS Tool Statistics that we are working on to create maps and information graphics on each of the new PA Congressional and Legislative Districts as they relate to the PA AML features contained within their boundaries; Signed on to the National Black Lung and RECLAIM Support Letter; Provided Dave Hess with an update on RECLAIM and SMCRA Reauthorization issues
- Attended a PA DEP EE Webinar presentation at the Stettler Learning Center, Wyoming Seminary, Kingston, PA with Laura Rinehimer, Watershed EE Specialist; Met with several professors interested in partnering on a mini-EE grant with EPCAMR
- Talked with Rebecca Newberry, Executive Director, Clean Air, Western NY, about the TESLA/Solar City Project in Buffalo, NY; Coal Communities from across the country have signed on to a letter support a just transition for jobs in the region that are environmental justice communities; Signed EPCAMR on to the letter and provided examples of how solar panel manufacturing can lead to workforce development and jobs on abandoned mine lands as alternative energy projects throughout Appalachia

- Andrea Nerozzi, Chair of the Science Department at Wyoming Seminary and artist, had her students
 experiment with EPCAMR's iron oxide pigment and they created a water-color based paint medium
 that they are going to be using on a Hexagon Project with EPCAMR
- Provided Laura Rinehimer, EPCAMR Watershed EE Specialist, with some content for the December EPCAMR monthly newsletter
- Dr. Bill Bolan, King's College-Director of the Shoval Center, has a Spring 2019 class with 5 media students ("Radio and Audio Production") who were looking for a nonprofit to partner with to produce a radio PSA; He asked EPCAMR if we would consider being a partner once again on another project with King's College; EPCAMR Staff would just tell them what message we'd like to get out, and then see if we liked what they made; If EPCAMR approves any spots Professor Cathy Donnelly, would distribute it to local radio stations; EPCAMR Executive Director agreed to allow EPCAMR to become a partner in the Spring 2019 to assist with our outreach efforts

Technical Assistance

- Reviewed the final NFWF Green Infrastructure Conceptual Plan Report and recommendations for the City of Wilkes-Barre completed by Clauser Environmental, LLC and EPCAMR prior to making copies for the City Council Meeting December 6th presentation; 9 public parks and mining impacted watershed areas were included in the report; Provided electronic copies of the report to *Joyce Morrash Zaykowski* and *Butch Frati*, Wilkes-Barre City Officials
- Worked on preparing the Huntsville Creek Coldwater Heritage Plan (CHP) grant for \$5000 and requesting Letters of Support from numerous partners in the Back Mountain that are located within the Toby Creek watershed in the Wyoming Valley; Tom Mayka, Stormwater Coordinator for the Dallas Area Municipal Authority (DAMA); Jackson Twp., Lehman Twp., Dallas Borough, Dallas Twp., PSU Wilkes-Barre, PEC, Representative Karen Boback, Representative Aaron Kaufer, Senator Yudichak, Senator Lisa Baker, North Branch Land Trust, The Luzerne Conservation District, The Lands at Hillside Farm, all provided letters of support; Waiting on one letter from the Stanley Cooper Chapter of TU; Prepared the budget and application and submitted to Ashley Wilmot-PA Trout CHP Program Manager
- Provided Mariah Davis, Field Manager for the Choose Clean Water Coalition (CCWC) with permission to use an EPCAMR photo and provided her with a description of the AMD image that the CCWC would like to use in an educational briefing booklet to legislators
- Provided David Kinney, Eastern National TU Policy Director, with substantial comments related to AMD and abandoned mine issues, at his request on their first PA Legislative Briefing being put together by TU
- Met with Guy Sheets, AMO Environmental Decisions, to reconnect after many years and to allow for him to inform EPCAMR of his current company's portfolio and to catch him up on EPCAMR projects in the region; Guy was an initial attendee at many of our charter EPCAMR meetings over 20 years ago; Forwarded information on some potential future work in Dauphin County in the Wiconisco Creek Watershed on AMD
- Provided a Letter of Support to Mansfield University, at the request of Jen Demchak, to go into some
 of the schools near Williamsport in Lycoming County, PA to talk about STEM Careers in the field of
 abandoned mine reclamation and any work that we have completed or are doing in NC PA

- PA DCED provided EPCAMR with permission to place cameras in Centralia in partnership with the Keep PA Beautiful Program after providing EPCAMR with a Release, Hold Harmless, and Indemnification document that needs to be signed; Had KPB review the document and it met their needs; EPCAMR Executive Director will bring it up for review and eventual signature at the 1st Quarter EPCAMR Board Meeting; Rob Dubas, Keep PA Beautiful is our Coordinator for the Camera Loaner Surveillance Program
- Michelle Schasberger, YMCA, is considering putting a PA DEP EE application in for an afterschool program Summer Camp Program she runs built around a butterly garden construction, however, there needs to be a connection to abandoned mine lands and funds available for Staff time and travel to participate; Followed up with a phone call to her to see if she is going to fully develop a proposal before the January 11th deadline; Provided her with a copy of our Green Infrastructure Best Management Practices Recommendations Report to the City of Wilkes-Barre for her review

 Received the November 29th lab sampling data results from Hawk Mountain Labs from the Mocanaqua AMD Tunnel and input the data into the Water Quality database; Provided SRBC with the most updated Water Quality database of our continuous monitoring efforts; Contacted Aaron Bierly-PA DCNR Senior Geologic Scientist and asked if he would assist with identifying rock lithology from within the Black Creek watershed that was buried several dozen feet below the surface at the location of BH3 near Stump's Lake; EPCAMR will send down a box of the rocks just after the New Year to be identified; EPCAMR will forward Aaron the Black Creek Geologic Report from the USGS
