# **Project Coordination**

# Harry E. Breaker Swoyersville Bank Reclamation PA AML Pilot Project

• Talked with Bernie Walko and Gerard Schmidt-PA DEP BAMR, about how Keystone Reclamation should develop their invoice and submit it to EPCAMR; Worked on and completed 1<sup>st</sup> Invoice for \$154,950 and Progress Report from July through December 2018 to submit to PA DEP BAMR; Work on the mobilization could only begin in December 2018 by Keystone Reclamation, once they had approvals from the PA DEP Pottsville District Mining Office and the two public informational meetings with the Swoyersville community were held; Coordinated with Matt Cochran-Keystone Reclamation to straighten out their Invoice and Narrative Report; Visited the project site to take photos and visually inspect the construction of the access road off Main Street, rock-lined swales, and mobilization area for the equipment to send down with the Progress Report and forwarded them to Staff

### Growboxx Food by Youth, Reclaiming Our Backyards in the Coalfields

Prepared a Comprehensive Summary Report and submitted it to Claudia Meglin and Pam Campbell ISI, Inc. to wrap up our work and coordination on the project and film through December 2018 and copied the EPCAMR Staff working on the project; Participated in a conference call with Claudia Meglin-Program Officer with ISI, Inc. to follow up on the submitted report and to discuss answering a few evaluation questions on the progress being made to date on the project for the Mental Insight Foundation before the end of January; Discussed next steps for the Winter/Spring 2019 on the project and the film; Forwarded the questions to Denise and Laura to assist in answering and followed up with Liz Masi-Environmental Education Coordinator at The Graham Academy to request a brief summary of the plantings that had occurred at the elementary center and the high school with her students; Followed up with Hannah Buckley in Mt. Carmel to let her know that ISI, Inc. and EPCAMR are working on securing additional funding to support their efforts in the Western Middle Coalfields in a similar fashion like we are in the Northern Coalfields; Sent around some planting resources and ebooks placed on our shared drive to the EPCAMR Staff that was ordered to support the project; Received the Summary Report from Liz Masi-The Graham Academy and prepared EPCAMR's Summary Evaluation Report for Claudia Meglin and Pam Campbell-ISI, Inc. and forwarded it to them along with a few photos for inclusion with her report to the Mental Insight Foundation at the end of the month on all of our collective progress and early successes

#### Mocanaqua AMD Mine Pool Consumptive Use Feasibility Study Project

Worked on 4<sup>TH</sup> Quarter Progress Report with Mike to submit to SRBC; Received the December 27<sup>th</sup> lab sampling data results from Hawk Mountain Labs from the Mocanagua AMD Tunnel and input the data into the Water Quality database; Worked with Denise to complete the Mocanagua Phase I and Phase II 4th Quarter Invoices to submit to SRBC; Provided SRBC with the most updated Water Quality database of our continuous monitoring efforts; Mailed Aaron Bierly-PA DCNR Senior Geologic Scientist the box of rocks to identify rock lithology from within the Black Creek watershed that was buried several dozen feet below the surface at the location of BH3 near Stump's Lake; Forwarded Aaron the Black Creek Geologic Open Report from the USGS; Aaron provided EPCAMR with a brief narrative Lithology Report on the types of rocks, cobble, and gravel pulled from BH3 during the air rotary drilling process that will be included in the State Forest Research Agreement Report; Reviewed file types of the Mocanagua Mine Pools in 3D in ArcGIS Pro with Mike; Sent Pierre down some of the datalogger readings from last year in the Fall; Coordinated with Tom Clark-SRBC to see if he can make it up on 1-28-19 to sample with the Staff down in the project area to grab a Ferrous and TOC sample at the Mocanagua Tunnel and to use the Kemmerer Bottle to get a depth integrated sampling of BH 1; Tom wasn't able to make it up this month so the EPCAMR Staff performed its routine sampling on 1-28-19 and mailed off the samples to Mahaffey Labs and coordinated a pickup by Hawk Mountain Labs: Requested 4 sets of additional sample bottles from Hawk Mountain Labs since EPCAMR ran out of bottles following this month's sampling event; Discussed with Tom Clark some of the flow results from the sampling event taken

### Upper Toby Creek Coldwater Conservation Plan Project

Conducted two days of field reconnaissance with Tom Mayka, Stormwater Manager for the Dallas Area Municipal Authority (DAMA), who is a partner on our project, providing EPCAMR with accurate location points being identified throughout the watershed at culverts, bridges, streambank areas with erosion problems, potential restoration sites, stormwater infrastructure issues, potential fishery improvement areas, potential stream monitoring points, potential riparian planting areas, and potential electroshocking sections of the creek and tributaries, with his GeoX7 Trimble GPS unit; Tom provided EPCAMR with GPS data files of the locations that were gathered in the field during the month of January; Competed two descriptive documents that were transcribed from the field notes and forwarded to Tom, John Levitsky-Luzerne Conservation District Watershed Specialist, and EPCAMR Staff; Described photos taken in the watershed in the document; The areas focused on for the two days were the unnamed tributaries to Toby Creek and Trout Brook to its headwaters along Lower Demunds Road on the northwest side of the watershed; Talked with John Levitsky about potential projects in the Upper Toby Creek watershed; John Levitsky was able to obtain permission for EPCAMR to check the unnamed tributary coming from private land east of Wyoming Road; Dr. Matt Hennessey from Dallas Veterinary Clinic owns the property; John is working on contacting the Friedman Farm to get access for assessment and plant riparian zones, but hasn't heard back from them; John referenced an unnamed tributary that comes from the southeast off Wyoming Road that wraps around north and south of Wyoming Road against Abraham Creek that could use an assessment

### **Technical Assistance**

- Talked with Jim Vorhees, a developer, originally from Seattle, WA, interested in sitting down with EPCAMR in the Spring 2019 to discuss solar projects on abandoned mine lands in PA; He wants to look at areas in Luzerne, Schuylkill, and other counties with abandoned mine lands that are either already reclaimed or in need of reclamation for development; He is interested in developing long-term lease agreements with landowners; He informed EPCAMR that viable solar generation projects on abandoned mine lands in the 70 acre range can produce 1MW for every 10 acres; On 100-200 acre abandoned mine lands, his company can produce 20-40 MWs
- Provided AML Statistics to Eric Cavazza-PA DEP BAMR, to provide to Ryan Ellis-IMCC for the new Congressional Legislative Districts in PA for Congressman Cartwright and GT Thompson; Asked Eric to talk to PA DEP Staff to come up with a current cost of reclamation per acre and a way to estimate the costs of water treatment of AMD per gallon since the figures being used are nearly a decade old
- Provided a Letter of Support to Liz Rosser-PSU Extension Master Watershed Stewardship Program
  Coordinator for the PA Riverfront Parks Committee, who proposed a PA American Water Camp for
  underserved youth in the Wyoming Valley to the PA DEP Environmental Education Grant Program;
  EPCAMR will lead an AMD Tie-Dye Workshop for the youth and provide an education tour of the
  Askam Maelstrom Oxidizer AMD Treatment System in Hanover Township, PA to teach them about
  AMD and watershed restoration efforts of EPCAMR and EC

- Provided Scott Brady, Stanley Cooper Chapter TU President with contact information for John Levitsky, Luzerne Conservation District Watershed Specialist to discuss becoming a partner on a small dam removal at The Lands at Hillside Farms (TLHSF) on Huntsville Creek; Scott is interested in having the Chapter do a casting instruction workshop and had followed up with Chet Mozloom from TLHSF; Informed him of EPCAMR's recent application to conduct a watershed assessment on Huntsville Creek through the PA Trout CHP Program
- Ranked four Wildlife Action Plan Conservation Opportunity Area Tool URLs for the PA Game Commission and sent it along to Catherine Haffner-PGC Wildlife Diversity Conservation Planning Coordinator and Diana Day-Conservation Coordinator for the PA Fish & Boat Commission
