## Upper Toby Creek Coldwater Conservation Plan Project

 Requested a final copy of the Fishery Electroshocking survey from TU to upload to our Story Map on the EPCAMR website from Kathleen Lavelle-TU; Allison Lutz, TU provided EPCAMR with the final copy

#### Huntsville Creek Coldwater Conservation Plan Project

- Continued some culvert assessments in the Lower Toby Creek watershed with the EPCAMR Interns and DAMA Stormwater Coordinator, *Tom Mayka* over several days; Reviewed and approved crossings in the NAACC database
- Picked up a GPS Booster for our iPad since the EPCAMR Staff were getting a weak signal in the field
- Directed Staff to continue working on culvert assessments in the watershed
- Completed our macroinvertebrate study on the Huntsville Creek monitoring sites with EPCAMR Staff and Interns on July 16 and 21<sup>st</sup>
- Sent postcards to some landowners that EPCAMR was trying to reach in the watershed to access culverts for assessments of aquatic passage

- The House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee marked up the Water Resources and Development Act (WRDA) 2020, which is typically taken up every 2 years by Congress, and authorizes a bulk of the water infrastructure activities conducted by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers; EPCAMR submitted proposed and ongoing projects in June to the US ACE that are in need of funding; Provided contact information for EPCAMR's contacts with the US ACE to *Branden Diehl*-Grant and Project Consultant for the Foundation for PA Watersheds
- Provided Jarrett Gibbons, ARIPPA Executive Director with Mike's detailed analysis and the Executive Director's comments in rebuttal to the Sierra Club's Economic Analysis of Alternative Programs for Managing Waste Coal in Central Appalachia completed by ECONorthwest from 2009 in preparation for a conference call with Senator Casey's Office Staff to let them know the benefits to the beneficial use of coal ash from ARIPPA plants in PA for reclamation and AMD remediation; EPCAMR provided Senator Casey's Staff with EPCAMR's points in support for waste coal to electrical generation and the Co-Generation Industry Tax Credit bill that is being considered; EPCAMR offered to shoot a 360 video of a Co-Gen Plant with permission of the Plant Manager to ARIPPA to help educate people on the operations of the plant and their benefits to the community
- Assisted Joe Simons, Stanley Cooper Chapter TU, with preparing a \$1500 Forever WILD Grant Application for a modified limestone diversion well water treatment system installation on Hightower Run in the Bowman's Creek; Measured some field distances in the watershed along the tributary and looked for a suitable location for the limestone system; Prepared a Letter of Support for the application on behalf of EPCAMR; Provided Joe with an online <u>calculator</u> to help with determining the size and prize estimation of limestone provided by Tussey Mountain as an example to determine costs; Kyle Argenziano-OSMRE VISTA Steward created 2 maps of the watershed and High Tower Run tributary to assist Joe with his application submission

  expensive and it seems most researchers will use it to set up Turbidity/TSS curves at
  multiple sites instead of reading TSS directly at each site to keep costs and maintenance
  down
- Signed up for <u>Drone Boss</u> FAA 107 Study Guide Materials/Videos to be able to study and sit for the License Certificate to be able to fly our recently purchased drone through a grant provided to EPCAMR by the Luzerne Foundation's Youth Allocation Committee; Paid the drone vendor for our ordered drone and supplies/equipment

## **Education & Outreach**

- Talked with Justin Dula, PA DEP OEJ about the potential partners that his office could reach out to in order to invite them to the Scranton Environmental Justice Roundtable; Provided him with contact names, numbers, e-mails, and websites for follow up; Sent an e-mail around to EPCAMR's contacts in Lackawanna County to introduce them to Justin for him to follow up with them
- Spoke with Senator Casey's Staff to discuss the Coal Refuse Tax Credit bill and explain how reclamation occurs on abandoned mine lands once the waste culm is removed from the sites
- Forwarded some Environmental Education resources on trout, macroinvertebrates, watershed monitoring, freshwater ecology to *Laura Rinehimer* and *Shawnese Taylor*, EPCAMR Staff for consideration in referencing when developing programs
- EPCAMR forwarded a few images of fly ash cores from the Huber Bank reclamation in Hanover Township, Luzerne County to ARIPPA to show them how solid they were and in case they needed a few pictures of what the cores look like
- Looked into a Chesapeake Bay Foundation Professional Development opportunity on tree planting with students being provided by *Liz Glaston*, Environmental Educator
- Picked up donated artwork from Sue Hand at Sue Hand Imagery created with iron oxide pigment from EPCAMR

  willing to write a letter of support for the HR 4735 (*Mine Affected Community Energy and Environment Act*); This bill allows a new tax credit for the production of electricity from a
  coal refuse facility. A "coal refuse facility" means any facility (1) that was originally placed
  in service prior to January 1, 2019 and combusts coal refuse or fuel composed of at least
  75 percent coal refuse by BTU energy value; and (2) uses at a minimum, a circulating

fluidized bed combustion unit or a pressurized fluidized bed combustion unit, equipped with a limestone injection system for control of acid gases, and a fabric filter particulate emission control system; There are still remaining piles in Sullivan County that are semi-anthracite that haven't been reclaimed yet that could potentially be hauled to a Co-Gen Plant for energy generation that would allow for the future reclamation of the local sites throughout the watersheds in Sullivan County; *Jarrett Gibbons*-ARIPPA provided *Marc Lewis*-President, with additional resources and an update on the status of the bill in preparation for the LCWA to provide a letter in support of HR 4735

- Lorelle Steach, Executive Director, of the PA Envirothon asked for permission to use a
  photo of an abandoned mine land landscape in the Soils and Land Use Envirothon Study
  Guide, with full credit being given to EPCAMR; EPCAMR Executive Director, who is a
  long-time colleague of Lorelle's positively gave her permission to use the photo
- Participated in a conference call with the Choose Clean Water Coalition to review the draft PA Legislative Briefing Book; EPCAMR has provided valuable input and photos for the book on AMD/AML issues facing PA
- John Curley, PA DEP BAMR in Western PA is working with a producer through PBS
  about one of their reclamation projects; They were looking for pictures of youth or
  students working around AMD or near AMD; PA DEP BAMR doesn't have any good
  images so they requested some from EPCAMR; EPCAMR Executive Director sent off a
  dozen images that they might be able to utilize and give proper photo credits
- Phoebe Lind-Policy Intern, (ACORE), Washington DC, interviewed the EPCAMR Executive Director about our work in supporting coal mining impacted communities; She was interested in our general observations as the U.S. energy industry transitions away from coal; She's a student at George Washington University; A major component of her internship experience is an independent research project, which she is undertaking; For her research, she's looking into how local governments and communities are approaching a just transition as the U.S. moves to a clean energy economy and is interested in strategies that address coal communities experiencing economic decline; EPCAMR Executive Director provided her with insight on the topic to aid her in her research and provided her with photos and documents that might be helpful for her to reference and cite
- Reviewed the National RECLAIM Working Group's public relations strategy draft and participated in a Zoom call to discuss
