### **Education & Outreach**

- Followed up with *Denise* to see if we could reapply for the <u>First Federal Charitable Foundation</u> grant in Hazleton
- John Dawes suggested that EPCAMR submit our Harry E. Breaker Swoyersville Bank
   Reclamation PA AML Pilot Project video to the DC Environmental Film Festival in 2019
- Nominated EPCAMR to 1% for the Planet's consideration for funding in their Quarter 3
  Funding Cycle; Followed up with Gina Schiappacasse, Press Liaison/Social Media Director
- Followed up with Joe Sapienza and John Welsh about the development of the EPCAMR Trailer and Mini-Series development project entitled "*Reclaiming PA*"; EPCAMR has looked over the budget and letterhead; They have a good handle on the pre-post animation production costs, in terms of budget development; We decided to start looking for various art and media production locations or foundations to see if they will pick it up since EPCAMR doesn't have funding up front; Provided them with topics of interest to be more focused related to abandoned mine lands and polluted mine water from past mining practices throughout the Anthracite and Bituminous Coal Regions of Northeastern and Northcentral PA; The Executive Director believes that we will need to give a brief overview of what the series will have included in it; AMD Tie Dye Workshop, Trout Stream Restoration, Aquatic Connectivity Culvert Assessments, Monitoring and Maintenance of AMD Discharges and Treatment Systems, Environmental Education Programs in Underserved School Districts, GIS Watershed Mapping, 3D Mine Pool Modeling, Mine Subsidence Insurance Mapping, Conference Coordination, Mine Fire Monitoring, Illegal Dump Site Cleanups, Economic Redevelopment through Reclamation on Abandoned Mine Lands, and AMD and Art; Scheduled some pilot testing field day trips with *Joe* and *John* on July 17<sup>th</sup> to shoot the pilot footage with *Mike* and the Executive Director; Youth were invited to be cast for parts in the pilot

- Provided an AMD Tour for 9 University of Maryland Field School students studying archaeology, who were working at Eckley's Miner's Village under the direction of Dr. Paul Shackel, the Director of the Department of Anthropology; Dr. Shackel chose to focus on AMD remediation and abandoned mine reclamation as a current issue for his students due to high interest in EPCAMR's work in the region
- Beth Berkhauser-The Hexagon Project and co-author of the Iron Oxide AMD & Art Curriculum with Mellisa Cruise and the EPCAMR Executive Director reviewed and finalized the Iron Oxide AMD & Art Curriculum prior to it being released at the PA AMR Conference in State College on June 20-21st; Made edits, provided comments, and added photos as needed to the curriculum
- EPCAMR Executive Director confirmed making a presentation before the entire PA Fish & Boat Commission and the Habitat Restoration Committee in Harrisburg to discuss EPCAMR's work in the region
- EPCAMR Executive Director participated as a guest speaker on a National <u>RECLAIM</u>
  Webinar on June 13<sup>th</sup> as a co-host with the Alliance for Appalachia to discuss RECLAIM PA
  AML Pilot Projects and examples of economic redevelopment opportunities in AML projects;
  Provided the EPCAMR Staff with a document on the <u>Black Lung Fund</u> issue that is tied to
  RECLAIM for their review; Created a press release that was picked up by the <u>PA</u>
  <u>Environmental Digest</u>; <u>Slides</u> were available following the webinar
- Informed Professor George Gomez, University of Scranton Biology Department that EPCAMR
  would work with the University to make an AMD Environmental Education presentation to the
  McNichols Elementary school in partnership with him in the future if he was interested
- EPCAMR Staff participated in a PA AML Campaign SMCRA Reauthorization conference call
  to discuss talking points; Provided Staff with a one page document on Innovative Mine
  Reclamation Projects that are happening throughout Appalachia
- Attended the Schuylkill Action Network Meeting in Schuylkill County, at the Schuylkill Conservation District to review 15 years' worth of projects and successes
- Travelled around the Wyoming Valley showcasing Nick Malawsky, Reporter and a photographer from the Patriot-News in Harrisburg, PA AMD and abandoned mine lands for a feature cover story on AMD in PA
- Provided the EPCAMR Staff with a bulleted list of projects and updates for the upcoming few months monthly EPCAMR Newsletter and tasks that Staff should be working on throughout the Summer

 Met with *Dr. Jessica Nolan*, University of Scranton Professor of Environmental Education to inform her more about EPCAMR's work in the region and to coordinate a showing of the Centralia documentary for her students

- Reached out to <u>United by Blue</u> to see if they can provide any assistance with future cleanups in the EPCAMR Region; *Ed Wytovich* provided EPCAMR with a link to their site
- Provided Jessica Sprajcar Aiello, RiverStewards Collaborative with links to water quality databases and economic reports on improving water quality and abandoned mine lands in our region for future discussion at their Forum on August 13<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> at the Dixon University Center in Harrisburg
- Provided Earth Conservancy with a Letter of Support for their PA DEP Growing Greener Grant submission on the continued remediation of Espy Run in the Nanticoke Creek watershed
- Provided Stream Restoration Inc. with a Letter of Support for their PA DEP Growing Greener Grant submission for continuing work on Datashed
- Informed Professor Vincent Marshall that EPCAMR has plenty of water quality data on the Old Forge Borehole if he was interested in obtaining some of it for his Biology Class at the University of Scranton or would like to have EPCAMR along for a field tour of the AMD discharge in the Lackawanna Valley to discuss our work on the borehole with our partners in the watershed
- Provided Gabby Zawacki, Environmental Specialist-DHL/Patagonia with donated non-GMO milkweed seeds for her company to start a Monarch Waystation in the Industrial Park
- Prepared a Letter of Support for Dr. Jen Demchak, Mansfield University-Chair of the
  Department of GeoSciences and Lead on the Watershed Management Program, after
  reviewing her new program that is a 2 year Associates Degree related to the a resource
  extraction industry informing her of what types of classes, software, trainings, and hands-on
  technical training and experiences students should expect to have to become employable
- Met with Dan Bochicchio, Skybernetics, at EPCAMR to discuss drone technology use in AML and to discuss his presentation for the PA AMR Conference; Toured our Solomon Creek
   Dam Removal and Stream Habitat Improvement Project for him to test fly and get some additional footage for his presentation
- Talked with Clint LeRoy, Principal for Marg Energy, Inc., who is interested in getting involved in AMD remediation and AML reclamation in PA; Informed him that EPCAMR could set up a tour of AMD sites and AML lands with him in the late Summer, early Fall 2018 to see if he can develop some potential projects with private landonwers and coal companies in the region

- EPCAMR will be creating new Congressional District Map overlays of AMD/AML for the newly created legislative boundaries during redistricting; The numbers can change considerably what is going to be in each particular State Legislator's and Congressional Districts when it comes to PA AML Sites, acreage of AML, number of AMD discharges, total number of stream miles impaired by AMD, number of problem areas, number of feature points within the Problem Areas, estimated cost of reclamation/acre, etc.; The PA AML Campaign requested our technical assistance in preparing these maps over the Summer while EPCAMR Staff attended the Strategic Planning Session on SMCRA Reauthorization in Huntingdon, PA at the Foundation for PA Watershed's Cabin on June 15<sup>th</sup>
- WPCAMR, Tetra-Tech, and EPCAMR are considering putting together a PA AML Pilot project for 2019 on *Rare Earth Elements Sampling* across PA; Convened a conference call and notes on the approach, proposal, and process, along with tasks for responsible partners; EPCAMR to come up with 20 AMD sites or treatment sites to be sampled in the EPCAMR Region and WPCAMR will do the same; Both organizations will be responsible for collecting the samples and funds will be budgeted for the Staff time and Travel to obtain the samples; Proposal will be worked out over the next few months
- Met with Kelly Gutshall, President of LandStudies, Inc. to discuss ways in which EPCAMR
  can continue to partner with her consultant firm on watershed projects in the future

   included prior to signing off on it; Attended a meeting at the PA DEP BAMR Office with BAMR
   Staff and partners to discuss how the grant agreement and funding is coming along
- Provided Gregg Davis, Project Advisor for PA DEP, with two Work Progress Reports on the
   Hicks Creek Natural Stream Channel Design/Construction Project; One was for the 1st
   Quarter of 2018 that takes in to account December 2017 through March 31, 2018 and the
   Final Report for the 2nd Quarter 2018 from April 1, through June 30, 2018; The Reports will
   go along with the Work Progress Report Sheets that EPCAMR Executive Director had sent
   along with the "See Attached Report"; EPCAMR will be finalizing all of the financials and
   expenditures utilizing some of the Working Capital and then making those submissions; A
   written request to move funds from one category to another will be included
- Directed Denise to review Quickbooks to see if we had previously created an Invoice for SRBC to send down on behalf of AES for submission on work completed for the Mocanaqua AMD Mine Pool Consumptive Use Feasibility Study Project; Mike made the EPCAMR version of the Mocanaqua Consumptive Use Feasibility Study Water Quality Monitoring Excel

data file editable for Staff and distributed it to project partners; The database will be added to on a monthly basis following sampling events and lab water quality data results, once they are returned from Hawk Mountain Labs and Mahaffey Labs; Followed up with *John Pippy*, AES on the initial results of the dye study which hasn't shown anything significant and the SRFA Agreement approval completion by PA DCNR; EPCAMR needed to provide additional signatures on the SFRA and will be circulating the documents to our President and Secretary; SRBC pulled the sondes to check the dye accumulation for the tracer study; Reported to SRBC that 3 months of water quality data was still not enough to establish a proper curve of the flow of the water; Requested publicly available water quality data from the SMP # 40150201, ID #36-10177 from the PA DEP Pottsville District Mining Office to assist EPCAMR and SRBC with our Consumptive Use Feasibility Study and State Forest Research Agreement with PA DCNR; Set up a meeting to come down and pull the water quality data from the file to assist with the project and background historical water quality data; Provided SRBC with an EPCAMR Progress Report and Invoices for Request for Payment up through June 2018

- Aaron Clauser, Clauser Environmental received the large transfer files of GIS maps for the City of Wilkes-Barre to begin creating updated maps for the parks and other areas around the City that we will be assessing under the Wilkes-Barre City NFWF Stormwater Technical Assistance Grant, Clauser Environmental has prepared base maps with aerial photos, LIDAR, and site boundaries for each of the 9 public spaces that we will be surveying; Filed a PA One-Call Notice for all 9 public spaces; Left a voicemail with Joyce Morrash-Zaykowski to bring her up to speed on the project; Shortly, Clauser Environmental will plot responses from PA One-Call on the maps; EPCAMR and Clauser Environmental will visit each of the sites and sketch the draft concepts on the base maps after brainstorming ideas for green infrastructure on July 10<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup>, 2018
- Followed up with Ben Lorson, PA Fish & Boat Commission Project Officer to see if the final reimbursement request was processed for EPCAMR to pay River Logic Solutions for the final construction work done on the Solomon Creek Dam Removal and Stream Habitat Restoration Project; Touched base with Matthew Williams, who is an Eagle Scout candidate for the Boy Scouts to see if he had put together his project application for submission to construct a small educational kiosk for the Ashley Borough Park and to secure funding for it as well as 4 trash containers for the Park; Matthew forwarded the documentation to EPCAMR to send along to Ashley Borough for approval; Sent along a letter to Greg Gulick, Ashley Borough Manager to have him sign the Landowner Access/Maintenance Agreement that was already signed by the EPCAMR President and send a copy back to EPCAMR to send along to the PA Fish & Boat Commission; Informed Greg that EPCAMR was working on the final interpretative sign for the park to illustrate the work that was done and who all the partners were on the project; Received the signed Landowner Access Agreement and forwarded an electronic copy to Ben Lorson-PA Fish & Boat Commission; Made an official request to PA Fish & Boat Commission to extend the agreement deadline to September 30, 2018 to

complete the interpretative sign and have it installed in the Ashley Borough Park and it was approved; EPCAMR Executive Director and EE Intern, Laura Rinehimer will:

- o list all of our project partners on the sign, including the construction contractor
- o where the funding came from
- o get logos of all partners, (unless we have them already) for placement on the sign
- o describe the dam removal process and benefits of the removal,
- describe the cross vanes that were placed in-stream and the reasons why they were constructed
- o include a few select photos in color for the sign
- o describe the use of native vegetation for streambank stabilization
- o decide on the size of the size and the construction materials to be used
- include a final design drawing as an element of the sign
