- Provided Claudia and Pam from ISI, an updated on the raised bed construction community garden at the Restored Church in the Heights section of Wilkes-Barre that EPCAMR assisted in constructing to provide donated Growboxxes, seeds, and plants to the volunteers who gardened and taught the youth about how small coal town patches like the City of Wilkes-Barre had originally planted their own gardens in their backyards; Shared photos and positive feedback from Wilkes-Barre City Councilwoman Beth Gilbert-McBride, who assisted with the project and was fully supportive of the effort;

- Paul Otruba, EPCAMR Volunteer, and Upper Susquehanna Riverkeeper, Tioga County, asked if there were any reclamation projects in need of sediment that is located behind at least 12 dams in PA; He estimates that 100,000 million cubic yards behind 4 hydroelectric dams alone in the Susquehanna River watershed; He figures conservatively, 150 million cubic yards of sediment available, 1 billion tons dry, will cap 31,000 acres at 3' deep or 49 sq miles of the estimated 250,000 acres of abandoned PA mine lands
