- Referred by ISI, Inc. to sign up and become a registered volunteer organizational member of <u>Global Regeneration CoLab</u>; Suggested that *Laura Rinehimer* sign up
- Invoiced and received payment for the 2nd Quarter and 3rd Quarter of 2020; A reminder had been sent about not receiving payment for the 2nd Quarter and an oversight was made by ISI, Inc. and they agreed to send both payments at once

Reclaiming Appalachian Coalition Innovative Mine Land Reclamation and Economic Development Projects Mini-Grant Program

- Communicated with Keith George-Solar Analyst, Community Energy about our project and his company's interest in continuing to have discussions with EPCAMR going forward on potential sites in the Anthracite Region; He mentioned keeping an eye on SB 705-known as the Alternative Energy Portfolio Standards Act, further providing for definitions and for interconnection standards for customer-generator facilities; providing for unsubscribed energy, for community solar facilities, electric distribution companies and subscriber administrators, for customer participation in community solar programs, for location of multiple community solar facilities and for ecology and stewardship; and making editorial changes
- Community solar allows anyone who pays an electric bill to participate in the benefits of solar energy without needing to install their own onsite system. Individual households, businesses, farmers, and non-profits would be able to purchase or subscribe to solar panels that make up a larger solar project and then receive a credit on their utility bill for the electricity generated by those panels; A bipartisan community solar bill in Harrisburg, House Bill 531, could kick-start renewable energy projects that would save consumers money on energy bills, create local jobs, pay farmers for allowing solar projects to be sited on their land, and generate tax revenue; There are over 200 shovel-

ready community solar projects in over **40** counties that are ready to go once this legislation passes, and those don't even include the sites EPCAMR is locating on reclaimed abandoned mine lands; EPCAMR sent a support letter to Senator *John Yudichak and* Representative *Eddie Day Pashinksi*

Swoyersville/Harry E. Reclamation and Community Athletic Area PA AML Pilot Project

- Sent a copy of the Extension Request Letter to Gerard Schmidt-Project Developer, PA DEP BAMR
- Swoyersville Borough Council met to discuss the extension and request for approval related to the title transfer of some of the property on October 5th
- Received a letter from Gerard Schmidt to sign and date and send back to him on the approval

 District Mining Office with some potential site locations for reforestation in the
 EPCAMR Region and contact information to follow up with including the Earth
 Conservancy, Lackawanna River Conservation Association, DeNaples, Pagnotti,
 and Susquehanna Coal Company; He reported it the suggestions to the 10K
 Mineland WorkGroup; The sites could be eligible for the NFWF Chesapeake Bay

- Made a suggestion to *Greg Griffin*, a volunteer member of the Wilkes-Barre City Blight Committee to ask the Mayor's Office and City Council to consider talking with the Earth Conservancy about setting up a recycling center for recycled products on their lands or reclaimed abandoned mine lands to store and generate larger quantities of recyclables that would be worth more on the market in bulk; This may help to curb the illegal dumping that we are experiencing throughout the City and the Valley locally on abandoned mines and along our stream corridors
- Reached out to Steven Reidell and Tracy Kessner, Avivid Water and suggested that
 they may want to exhibit at the PA AMR Virtual Conference; Their company is
 looking to sample AMD water for rare earth elements and have a TurboCoag
 electrocoagulation technology for treating AMD; EPCAMR may be able to assist
 them in the future with some professional services
- Provided the Huber Breaker Preservation Society Board Member, Pat Kennedy, with a copy of the template for the HBPS Letterhead
- Sent a few additional paver addresses down to Old Mille Impressions for the Huber Breaker Miner's Memorial Park that came in a little later than expected

 of service to the public if the Pennsylvania General Assembly abolishes its only inhouse source of environmental-policy analysis; The Joint Legislative Conservation
 Committee provides the General Assembly with objective and authoritative analysis
 of a broad range of economic, environmental, and social factors that all play a critical
 role in the way resources are used and reused; Submitted the letter to *Tony*Guerrieri, Executive Director on behalf of EPCAMR
- Updated Bridget Dowd-Youth Advisory Committee Director for The Luzerne
 Foundation on EPCAMR's progress with the drone, creating our banner, building our

Pennsylvania's abundant water resources - to exclude from its definition of "pollution" any "accidental discharge, spill or release that does not cause a violation of" a limited list of 15 water quality criteria, such as temperature, color, and bacteria; Senate Bill 619 also jettisons spill reporting requirements to the Pa Fish and Boat Commission and the PA Department of Environmental Protection leaving our waters unprotected from serious pollution events

- Sent Bert Myers, PA DEP EPCAMR photos of AMD and Centralia after a request came in from PACD and a few Conservation Districts; Informed Bert that the PA DEP can use any EPCAMR photos and just provide us with a photo credit
- Provided Representative Jerry Mullery with EPCAMR's position on the RGGI and our desire to see the Governor's veto upheld on HB 2025, a bill to take away the power of the PA DEP to enact a carbon reduction program, an update on our NFWF grant, and our support of waste coal to power legislation that would help keep the ARIPPA Co-Gen plants reclaiming abandoned mine lands
- Anne Daymut, WPCAMR and the Executive Director had an idea of coming up with a podcast on AML issues in PA and were going to think about it further over the Winter 2020; She was going to participate in an online webinar in November and get back to EPCAMR
