Watershed Reports

- Lackawanna NPDES permit approved to begin removing waste coal at Popple Colliery. Pump Storage project property is under option to buy and long-term lease on adjacent properties. Early June for QHUP scope of work.
- Luzerne Planted 275 trees in Dallas with EPCAMR and 2000 trees total in the past few months.
- Schuylkill Reevesdale AMD Treatment System back online. River Corridor project in progress hauling coal silt out of the floodplain.
- Nescopeck Essentially no feedback from the 2018 sampling report. Conducting 2019 testing in cooperation with PA DEP BAMR. Kayak trip was successful.

General Staff

- Scanned & cataloged 224, georeferenced 297, & created Wilkes-Barre West quad. mosaics from PA DEP Bureau of Abandoned Mine Reclamation (BAMR) Wilkes-Barre Office and Pottsville District Mining Office (DMO) collections to continue the 2018-2020 Mine Subsidence Insurance (MSI) Mine Map Processing Grant coordinated by the California DMO. Maintain a backup on our 14TB local server.
- Finish and submit a monitoring report of **Loyalsock Creek** AMD Treatment Systems
- Evaluate Plainsville AMD pond sludge depth with Luzerne Conservation District
- Working with Wiconisco Creek Restoration Association, SRBC, Dauphin CD & Doc Fritchey TU to develop a monitoring plan for areas in Bear Creek Watershed.
- **Keystone Reclamation** actively removing waste coal piles at the former Harry E. Colliery related to the **Swoyersville AML Pilot** project
- Finish up \$12K contract with Luzerne County Rail Corp. to scan, georeference and digitize railroad maps in Luzerne and Lackawanna Counties.
- Continue to work on the GrowBoxx project with \$25K Inquiring Systems Inc. Develop a curriculum and work with schools to implement program.
- Continue an aquatic organism passage (AOP) study on creeks in the **Toby Creek Area** with a \$15K grant from **Patagonia**.
- Continue \$21K **SRBC** Phase 1 Contract to map/model mine pools related to the **Mocanaqua Tunnel Discharge (Luzerne Co.)** and \$65K Phase 2 contract to monitor boreholes / discharges. Need to catch one low precipitation event by fall, hopefully.
- Continue "City Streets to Valley Streams" education program with disadvantaged youth using \$10K from First Federal Charitable Foundation and another \$10K from Luzerne Foundation for this year.
- Begin on Huntsville Creek Cold Water Heritage Plan \$4.75K funding from PA TU.
- Continue **Toby's Creek** Coldwater Heritage Plan with \$5K funding from **PA TU**.
- Continue to monitor chemistry/flow at Askam Treatment System in the Nanticoke Creek Watershed as needed by Earth Conservancy.
- Administer the \$2.5K ARIPPA AMD/AML Reclamation Awards for EPCAMR Region.
- Bill-down and reimburse for projects and services (quarterly) to maintain cash-flow.
- Working on **RECLAIM** outreach with \$3K grant from **Appalachian Voices**.
- Continue to look for stream segments in the **EPCAMR Region**, where improvements have been made to streams on the 303 (d) List of Impaired Waters, that should be reassessed and stand a good chance of being removed from the list. Gather supporting water quality monitoring or biological monitoring evidence and report to the **PA DEP Bureau of Conservation and Restoration (BCR) Section 319 Program**.
- Continue to provide technical & outreach assistance to **EPCAMR partners** dealing with AML issues, as needed.
- Plan for the joint NAAMLP/NASLR/PA AMR joint via conference call with PA DEP and the AMR Conference Committee. The conference will be September 8-11, 2019 in Pittsburgh. Maintain www.NAAMLP2019.com and treatminewater.com
- Working with WVSA on developing a professional services agreement for AMD portion of the MS4 Permit.
- Continue to provide AMD Field Tours and participate Environmental Outreach events.
- Completed another update of **RAMLIS** for 2019 with updated information from the **Pennsylvania Spatial Data Access (PASDA) Server**.
- Update EPCAMR websites, including www.epcamr.org as needed, as well as the G Suite for Nonprofit Email / App Account and Facebook Social Media outreach tools.
- Participate in AML Campaign Calls to keep up on legislative happenings.
- Create monthly progress reports, post them to the EPCAMR website and send to PA DEP BCR Section 319 Program along with an invoice of time and resources spent for reimbursement.
- Harvest, dry, process, package, and inventory Iron Oxide products to sell online.
- Complete EPCAMR Annual Reports and post to GuideStar.org.
